RE: Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) – District of Columbia
Adjustment Request for Reporting Requirements Due to Novel Coronavirus
(COVID-19) – Denial

Dear Ms. Seymour:

This letter is in response to the District of Columbia Department of Human Services (DHS) request to adjust SNAP regulations at 7 CFR 273.10(f)(1) and 273.12(a)(5)(iii), which require at least one contact with a household every 12 months and a periodic report for households assigned to simplified reporting if the certification period exceeds 6 months.

FNS recognizes that the State is facing workload challenges at this time due to the COVID-19 public health emergency. However, based on the data submitted by the State, FNS is denying this request because the adjustment is not necessary to be consistent with what is practicable under actual conditions in the State. FNS would like to work with the State agency in moving to operations that are consistent with SNAP regulations.

FNS stands ready to provide technical assistance and will consider future requests for adjustments if circumstances in the State change, such as a spike in new applications, or the general workload increases, and sufficient data is provided to support these flexibilities during the public health emergency.
