



FIRST 100 DAYS AT FNS

Under the leadership of Secretary Rollins, USDA's FNS has taken swift and decisive action to be representative of the change the American people voted for.

Policy that Drives American Self-Sufficiency

- Launched the "[More than a Job](#)" campaign to connect SNAP recipients to employment and encourage self sufficiency

Policy that Makes America Healthy Again

- Encouraging and prioritizing State efforts to implement [innovative](#) approaches to healthier purchases
- Secretary Rollins and Secretary Kennedy [announced](#) a line-by-line review of the Scientific Report of the 2025 Dietary Guidelines Advisory Committee and committed to releasing the final Guidelines ahead of its statutory deadline of December 31, 2025
- Worked alongside the International Dairy Foods Association (IDFA) to [announce](#) the IDFA Healthy Dairy in Schools Commitment, a voluntary, proactive pledge to eliminate Red 3, Red 40, Green 3, Blue 1, Blue 2, Yellow 5, and Yellow 6 in milk, cheese, and yogurt products sold to K-12 schools for the National School Lunch and Breakfast Programs

Policy and Action that Strengthen Program Integrity

- Completed 1,695 SNAP retailer investigations, of which 937 retailers were penalized for program violations
- Identified and removed nearly 3,200 non-redeeming SNAP retailers to minimize potential fraud
- Set clear SNAP guidance on [Alien Sponsor requirements](#), ensuring benefits obtained by sponsored aliens are reimbursed to the American taxpayer
- Put states on notice of the Administration's expectation for [timeliness in processing SNAP applications](#)
- Clarified that SNAP benefits are not available to [revoked parole status to non-citizens](#)
- Reaffirmed expectations of states to [ensure accuracy of benefit issuance](#)—prioritizing the reduction of improper payments to recipients

Policy and Action that Respects the Generosity of Taxpayers

- [Terminated all radical DEI Blanket Purchase Agreements](#) signed by the previous Administration—saving nearly \$100 million
- Cut over \$110 million in non-mission critical contracts
- Cancelled wasteful travel and conferences saving \$17 million
