RE: SNAP – Oregon Adjustment to Postponed Expedited Interviews – Extension  
– Denial

Dear Mr. Haun:

This letter transmits the Food and Nutrition Service (FNS) denial of the Oregon Department of Human Services (DHS) adjustment request (COV-150) to continue to adjust the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) requirement for households to complete an interview prior to approval for expedited benefits during the month of July 2020.

FNS recognizes that the State is facing challenges in processing initial and ongoing cases for certification at this time due to the COVID-19 public health emergency. However, based on the data submitted by the State, FNS does not find that an extension of the adjustment is necessary to be consistent with what is practicable under actual conditions in the State. FNS would like to work with the State agency on a transition plan that moves the State forward toward operations that are consistent with certification regulations at 7 CFR 273.2(i)(3)(iii) and 273.2(i)(4)(iii)(A) and (B) immediately.
