Washington State is requesting a waiver to allow SNAP-Ed staff time to assist in meal planning, purchasing, packaging, preparing, and distributing with open food distribution sites serving the SNAP-eligible population in response to the current COVID-19 emergency situation.

The proposed waiver would allow SNAP-Ed providers to maintain or create important partnerships with schools and food banks that serve SNAP-Ed goals while remaining connected, if indirectly, to the community they serve by providing much-needed food distribution support during the unprecedented outbreak. STATE WAIVER REQUEST

SNAP-Ed Assistance in Food Distribution

2. Type of request: Initial

3. Regulatory citation: 2 CFR 200 Subpart E; SNAP-Ed Guidance Page 78, 80, 82, 83

5. Region: Western

- **6. Regulatory requirements:** According to the SNAP-Ed Guidance, unallowable costs include:
 - school-based food service activities, paying food service workers, or any
 efforts focused on implementing new meal patterns for reimbursable meals
 or snacks;
 - ongoing snack or food service;
 - meal sized portions or complete meal service;
 - cost of food provided as groceries or supplemental food;
 - Training or development costs of food service workers or others not directly associated with delivery of SNAP-Ed; and
 - Salaries for retail store staff, farmers market managers, or food service workers for service operations.
- 7. Proposed alternative procedures: Under the proposed waiver, SNAP-Ed staff time could be used to assist in meal planning, purchasing, packaging, preparing, and distributing with open food distribution sites serving the SNAP-eligible population, including schools and food banks. In addition to schools and food banks, SNAP-Ed providers could offer these services in other food distribution settings that reach the SNAP-eligible population. This waiver request does not include allowing SNAP-Ed funds to pay for the cost of food provided as groceries or supplemental foods.
- **8. Justification for request:** The proposed waiver would allow SNAP-Ed providers to maintain or create important partnerships with schools and food banks that serve SNAP-Ed goals while remaining connected, if indirectly, to the community they serve by providing much-needed food distribution support during the unprecedented outbreak.

Schools and food banks are the top programming sites for SNAP-Ed in Washington State. In response to COVID-19, all schools in Washington State are closed at least until April 24. FNS approved waivers enabling Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) and National School Lunch Program Seamless Summer Option (SSO) sponsors to serve meals in a non-congregate setting and at school sites during

school closures related to the coronavirus. Food banks rely on volunteer support, and many regular volunteers are older adults who are more vulnerable to COVID-19 and therefore no longer volunteering. SNAP-Ed educators have expertise in nutrition and safe food handling but cannot perform planned in-person activities, which for some constitutes a large portion of work, as all have been suspended for the health and safety of the eligible participants and providers.

- **10. Anticipated impact on households and State agency operations:** This waiver would increase the capacity of schools, summer meal sites, and food banks to distribute meals to SNAP-eligible children and adults. This waiver would not impact State agency operations.

Anticipated implementation date and time period for which waiver is needed (please indicate if the waiver approval is needed to make system adjustments): SNAP-Ed providers will participate in meal planning, purchasing, packaging, preparation, distributing, and cleaning with qualifying food distribution sites from the approval date of this waiver until the end of the national emergency or USDA revokes the waiver.
