WAIVER RESPONSE

1. **Waiver serial number:** 970148
2. **Type of request:** Extension and Modification
3. **Primary regulation citation:** 7 CFR 273.24(f)
4. **Secondary regulation citation:**
5. **State:** Arizona
6. **Region:** Western
7. **Regulatory requirements:** 7 CFR 273.24 provides that no individual shall be eligible to participate in the Food Stamp Program as a member of any household if, during the preceding 36-month period, the individual received food stamp benefits for not less than 3 months (consecutive or otherwise), during which the individual did not work 20 hours or more per week, averaged monthly; did not participate in and comply with the requirements of a work program for 20 hours or more per week; did not participate in and comply with requirements of a program under Section 20 or a comparable program established by the State; or was exempt from these requirements.

7 CFR 273.24(f) also provides that, upon the request of a State agency, the Secretary may waive the applicability of the above provision for any group of individuals in the State if the Secretary makes a determination that the area in which the individuals reside has an unemployment rate of over 10 percent, or does not have a sufficient number of jobs to provide employment for the individuals.

8. **Proposed alternative procedures:** The Arizona State Agency is requesting a two-year extension of its current ABAWD waiver in the following geographic areas:
 - Apache, Cochise, Coconino, Gila, Graham, Greenlee, La Paz, Mohave, Navajo, Pinal, Santa Cruz, Yavapai, and Yuma counties;
 - Towns of Sells and Ajo within Pima County;
 - Tohono O'odham reservation areas (also known as Papago) within Maricopa, Pinal, and Pima counties that includes San Xavier, Gila Bend, and Florence Village; and
 - Pascua Yaqui Reservation within Pima County.

Arizona is also requesting to modify its waiver request by adding the following geographic areas:

- El Mirage, Sun City West, and Youngtown within Maricopa County; and
- Fort McDowell and Salt River Indian Reservations within Maricopa County.

The chart below illustrates data Arizona obtained from the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS), showing that the 13 counties had an unemployment rate of at least 20 percent above the national unemployment rate of 5.5 percent, or 7.2 percent, for the 36-month period of calendar years 2003 through 2005:

$1,458,070 / 20,299,927 = 0.0718$

$0.0718 \times 100 = \mathbf{7.18, \text{ or } 7.2 \text{ percent}}$

Because unemployment data was not available for some of the smaller requested areas, the State agency used census share ratios based on the 2000 Census and whole county data obtained from BLS. Arizona then clustered the areas as follows to show that each area had an aggregate unemployment rate of at least 20 percent above the national average of 5.5, or 6.6 percent, for the 36-month calendar years of 2003 through 2005:

- 9. Justification for request:** To ensure the equitable distribution of food stamp benefits in areas experiencing high unemployment.
- 10. Action and reason for approval or denial:** We are approving the State agency's request in full. Able-bodied adults without dependents (ABAWDs) who reside on the aforementioned areas will be exempt from work requirements based on the areas having an unemployment rate at least 20 percent above the national average of 5.5, or 6.6 percent, for the 36-month calendar years of 2003 through 2005. Note that we did make some mathematical adjustments to the final unemployment rate figures to reflect correct rounding.
- 11. Regulatory or legislative basis for action:** The waiver is approved pursuant to 7 CFR 273.24(f), which allows the Secretary to waive the applicability of the work requirement provision for any group of individuals in the State if the Secretary makes a determination that the area in which the individuals reside has insufficient jobs.
- 12. Conditions and reasons:** None.

13. **Information required for extension:** To receive an extension the State agency must provide data for the affected areas indicating that there continue to be insufficient jobs for individuals subject to 7 CFR 273.24.
14. **Expiration date:** The waiver is approved for two years, effective May 1, 2006 through April 30, 2008.
15. **Limitation on regional office approval of like requests:** Approval of this waiver is limited to the Arizona State agency.
