2. Estimates for inflation adjustment are calculated using FY 2019 meal counts for NSLP, SBP, and CACFP multiplied by the annual inflation change.

3. Estimates for the Keep Kids Fed Act (KKFA) are calculated by applying the temporary rate increase to FY 2019 meal service levels. KKFA provided an additional 40 cents for NSLP lunches, 15 cents for SBP breakfasts, 10 cents for CACFP meals, and all homes are reimbursed at the Tier I rates. These rate increases are available from July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023. DOD Army/Air force, DOD Marines, and DOD Germany are estimated to receive \$1,349,000, \$28,000, and \$235,000 respectively for inflation and KKFA changes
