SUMMARY OF PROGRAM

The Illinois Department of Human Services is a State agency devoted to improving the lives of Illinois' most vulnerable populations. Our Mission is building up families and individuals to help fully realize their contribution to society.

The objective of the SNAP Employment & Training program is to afford everyone we serve the opportunity to enhance their skills and education with the goal of doing meaningful work. It is our goal to creating pathways to family prosperity, health, and well-being and by assisting customers to access Employment & Training opportunities.

Illinois's SNAP Employment & Training program is focused on helping customers gain work skills, experience, earn credentials and find employment. Participants may be voluntarily enrolled in Non-Education, Non-Work Components (Supervised Job Search, Job Search Training, Job Retention and Workfare), Educational Components (Basic Education, Vocational Training, English Language Acquisition, and Work Readiness Training, and Work Experience components (Internship, On-the-Job-Training, Transitional Jobs), or a combination of these activities designed to help a customer increase their skills, employability and begin a career-path leading to self-sufficiency. Our program's goal is to offer skills growth to build people up to improve their possibly of attaining a job and earning better pay in order to better support themselves and their families.

Community Based Organizations (CBOs) recruit, orient, assess, refer, and deliver to eligible individuals, education and training programs which are best suited for their experience and interests. CBOs will also recruit employers to provide suitable work sites and employment opportunities for participants. CBOs and IDHS staff will provide case management and supportive services to participants along with at least one component, to overcome barriers to employment and maximize self-sufficiency. CBOs may design and implement their own programs using any of the available components with what works for their target customers and for their unique region or community. Providers may not offer any wage subsidies for any program components with SNAP E&T funds at this time.

IDHS's CBO partners are to place at least 50% of hired customers into jobs within industry growth sectors. This is one of the performance metrics outlined in providers' contracts. To determine growth sectors relevant to a particular geographic area, each service provider is encouraged to coordinate with their Local Workforce Investment Area (LWIA), other workforce agencies or employers to gather labor market data and identify local/regional high-growth sectors/industries. Employment and training activities are encouraged to be focused on those industries as well.

PROGRAM CHANGES

- Raise awareness about SNAP E&T among community partners and ABAWDs through additional marketing and outreach efforts.
- Begin intentional, meaningful engagement with Prairie Band Potawatomi Nation, in collaboration with the FNS Midwest Regional Office (MWRO).

Based on surveys and regular technical assistance calls with SNAP E&T providers, the State made several improvements to the Illinois SNAP E&T System (ISETS) to improve the user interface and experience and enhance the accuracy and trust in SNAP E&T data reporting.

Coordination

Coordination with the workforce development system consists of efforts to partner with workforce providers to directly serve SNAP E&T participants or to align the flow or types of services offered across programs.

Describe any special State initiatives (i.e. Governor-initiated or through State legislation) that include SNAP E&T. Describe any efforts taken by the State agency to coordinate these programs, services, partners, and/or activities with the State's E&T program.

IDHS holds a seat on the Illinois Workforce Investment Board (IWIB), which is the state’s workforce development board. The board meets quarterly and has an oversight capacity over WIOA but is not engaged in program operations. At the committee level there is more engagement on programmatic design, deployment and coordination. The Associate Director of the Office of Workforce Development (who oversees the SNAP E&T program for IDHS) or designee is occasionally assigned to attend the IWIB Board meetings for the Secretary.

IDHS will work with IWIB to gain information on what credentials are needed to help gain jobs in good paying, high demand/growth jobs, understanding how SNAP E&T fits into the overall workforce system and to develop strategies to work with the overall workforce.

The Office of Workforce Development also have staff dedicated to WIOA coordination and is a full participant on other important IWIB sub-committees, including the Intra- agency Implementation Team,

which works on cross agency coordination of programs and whose work is still ongoing. Currently this committee is continuing to focus on:

- Sector-specific strategies (e.g. in Information Technology (IT), energy, manufacturing, health care) including an overall methodology for identifying high priority sectors/occupations
- College and career pathways
- Dual credit
- Work-based learning (including apprenticeships)
- Data, research and evaluation
- Customer relationship management

The OWD also participates in the WIOA Professional Development Committee that works to strengthen the workforce system through offering wider resources to staff and providers in the field for ongoing professional development. We have a staff who is the OWD's WIOA coordinator that attends regularly and fully participates in these sub-committee meetings. Staff who attends these meetings, represents both programs overseen by the Office of Workforce Development including the SNAP and TANF E&T programs. The Professional Development Committee regularly sends out training resources so that Workforce professionals have access to the same information even if they are operating in different programs and from different state agencies.

Describe the extent to which the State agency is carrying out SNAP E&T programs in coordination with title I programs under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA).

There are 22 LWIAs statewide. Participation in the employment and training programs and services provided by LWIAs in their local service areas, qualify as work programs and meet the work requirement for ABAWDs.

The State's LWIAs connect individuals to Title I and II workforce services through offering access to education, training, and other resources, such as the American Job Centers. The SNAP E&T program attempts to take full advantage of the employment opportunities and training services available with other state and local entities. Some of this work is being coordinated by a WIOA Interagency Workgroup convened in partnership between IDHS and DCEO leadership and includes ICCB and IDES. The workgroup attempted to look at service delivery for ABAWDs statewide by all the interagency partners (DCEO, ICCB and IDES) to develop a more effective referral system to improve access to appropriate and available services to ABAWDs not only from IDHS but from any one of the partners. An initial data match suggests that there is not much cross over for ABAWDs and WIOA Title I services. This speaks to the need to improve referral opportunity and tracking. The One Stop Operator in Cook County developed a more sophisticated referral tracking mechanism which is different than the one mentioned in prior state plans. A pilot program for this improved referral tracking system was being developed and will be housed on the IL Worknet platform (similar to ISETS). The Universal Referral System will coordinate referrals for all 10 AJCs and partners across the Chicago/Cook County area. The One Stop Operator's Career Pathways Navigators, Illinois Department of Employment Security (IDES), and the Division of Rehabilitation Services (DRS) participated in the soft launch of the Airtable Referral System. The Division of Family and Community Services didn't participate in the soft launch, and we will see moving forward how the referral system best works for SNAP E&T.

The Secretary of IDHS has designated the Associate Director of the Office of Workforce Development to sit on the Chicago Cook Workforce Partnership Board (LWIA for Cook). This facilitates improved coordination and communication between IDHS and local WIOA services within the single largest and densest program area in the state. For example, learning about and receiving briefings on the Airtable referral pilot mentioned above.

IDHS staff are co-located at a number of American Job Centers throughout the State of Illinois to assist job seekers in applying for IDHS benefits. Additionally, where IDHS staff are not available, partners can assist customers in the navigation of the application process through ABE, IDHS's online benefits application system.

IDHS continues to find ways to improve integration and partnership with WIOA Title I and Title II services which strengthens potential engagement and outcomes with jobseekers. Our efforts are aimed at providing quality employment services to all Illinoisans through easily accessible technology and coordinated efforts with other service providers. Presently, referrals to WIOA are just a referral to an AJC and is not co-enrollment with SNAP E&T and WIOA services. This is mainly an outlet to get more people on SNAP access to more services. Through the new referral pilot IDHS hopes to better understand the outcomes and benefits of making referrals to SNAP customers to American Job Centers (AJCs).

The Office of Workforce Development operates both the SNAP E&T and the TANF E&T programs as well as other state operated programs such as our state funded Tax Preparation Assistance program and Employment Barrier Reduction Fund. Within the Office of Workforce Development these Employment and Training and related programs are centralized for services directed at adults. It allows for cross program collaboration or referral to another program when appropriate. Some providers have both TANF E&T and SNAP E&T contracts.

The SNAP E&T program coordinates with services provided by: Local Workforce Investment Areas (LWIAs) and their providers, the Illinois Department of Employment Security (IDES), the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity (DCEO) and the Illinois Community College Board (ICCB) and continues to try to improve in doing so. The State will continue to work with the interagency workgroup to broaden the referrals and tracking of participants who use WIOA services or the Illinois Community College system, specifically for at risk ABAWD's.

Through monthly reporting, we also ask our providers if they make any referrals for other services in the course of serving participants in SNAP E&T.

The Prairie Band Potawatomi Nation is the only federally recognized tribal nation in Illinois. FNS MWRO recently engaged the Tribal Council, which is based in Kansas, following IDHS' request for support in building a meaningful, collaborative relationship with the tribal nation. FNS MWRO met with Tribal Council Chairman Joseph (Zeke) Rupnick to initiate this dialogue. While there are currently no tribal members residing on the 130 acres of trust lands within the state, Chairman Rupnick shared there are tribal members who live throughout the state, particularly in Cook County. IDHS will continue partnering closely with FNS MWRO to ensure thoughtful planning, clear communication, and a respectful approach to engagement with the tribal nation that focuses on building trust. This foundation is essential for facilitating meaningful consultation and collaboration with the Prairie Band Potawatomi Nation in FY26.

The SNAP E&T Program is state administered through the Office of Workforce Development within the Illinois Department of Human Services (IDHS), Division of Family and Community Services (DFCS). Services are delivered through several stakeholder partnerships primarily with Community Based Organizations (CBO), Local Government Units (LGU) and non-profit organizations and DFCS's own Workforce Development unit. Contracts with community-based providers to deploy the program are developed by the Bureau of Employment and Training. Provider managers are tasked with assisting provide in executing program functions through TA and they perform annual program monitorings. E&T policy is predominantly set by the Office of Workforce Development, processes and procedures are decided by the Bureau Chief and the Associate Director.

How does the E&T unit coordinate and communicate on an ongoing basis with the units responsible for certification policy?

The E&T staff communicate with certification policy staff via regular meetings. These meetings are held at least quarterly. These meetings give both units the opportunity to discuss how policies, processes and procedures are working from both sides.

The E&T staff communicate with intermediaries or E&T providers via regular meetings. These meetings are held at least monthly. These meetings give both units the opportunity to discuss how policies, processes and procedures are working from both sides.

The Providers are given a program manual at the beginning of the contract year. Changes are sent to the providers and they are informed by their provider managers/grant manager. Major changes would also be communicated at quarterly meetings held with the full group of providers or a subset of providers by program if the information is not relevant to all SNAP E&T providers.

Participant information is entered into ISETS and is accessible by all parties who are involved in the delivery and monitoring of SNAP E&T and those who participate in the program.

ISETS tracks all SNAP E&T related information such as referrals, assessments, employment plans, supportive services, participation, activities, provider determinations and participant case notes

Describe the State agency's process for monitoring E&T providers' program and fiscal operations. Include plans for direct monitoring such as visits, as well as indirect monitoring such as reviewing program data, financial invoices, etc.

State staff monitor the program and fiscal operations of each provider annually. The provider managers (program grant managers) do a programmatic review and the Bureau of Community Service and Support, do a Fiscal Administrative Review (FAR). As of FY'22 programmatic reviews done in house by the Bureau of Employment and Training staff will be done annually for every provider. In these reviews, case files will be examined and supportive services (participant reimbursements) receipts and documents are checked and validated.

The FAR, consists of monitoring agency expenditures traced back to the grant and guided by rules in in the CFR and GATA (the Grants Accountability and Transparency Act). Agencies are monitored to see if fiscal governance and fiscal internal controls standards are being maintained. For areas of deficit the agency will be offered a corrective action plan with a timeline to make the correction. If they cannot then they may be put on the Stop Pay list followed by grant recovery processes if serious concerns are discovered and not able to be addressed or corrected. Depending on outcomes of past reviews determines the frequency needed of monitoring but is at a minimum of once every three years.

Also, every year prior to receiving a contract, providers must complete an Internal Control Questionnaire (ICQ) and a Programmatic Risk Assessment (PRA). Dependent upon the scores and answers to these questions, provider may have special conditions placed on their contract leading to more frequent reviews or monthly monitoring of supportive services issuances, for example.

The assessment involves gathering the customer's background, including age, literacy & education level, previous job training, work history and other factors relating to employability such as physical or mental health, recent hospitalizations, family situation or a need for immediate and ongoing supportive services. A customer is fit to participate if they have or need marketable job skills; need supportive services and/or help in seeking out potential employers; or lack education and/or work history. The customer must also be available and able to work once skills are developed and/or services are received.

These notes will be reviewed during the providers annual review to ensure that case management is being performed by every agency, for every SNAP E&T program participant.

Provider contracts include the case management requirement and that at a minimum monthly case management notes are required in the case files.

WORK EXPERIENCE COMPONENT: TRANSITIONAL JOBS

A transitional job is one that provides a time-limited work experience, that is wage-paid and subsidized, and is in the public, private, or non-profit sectors for those individuals with barriers to employment who are chronically unemployed or have inconsistent work history. These jobs are designed to enable an individual to establish a work history, demonstrate work success in an employee- employer relationship, and develop the skills that lead to unsubsidized employment. Transitional jobs must sustain interactions with industry or community professionals in real world settings, have firsthand engagement with the tasks required in a given career field, emphasizes employer engagement including specific training objectives, and leads to regular employment. Some examples of types of work are maintenance, landscape, and clerical. Transitional jobs must not provide any work that has the effect of replacing the employment of an individual, it must also provide the same benefits and working conditions that are provided at the job site to employees performing comparable work for comparable hours.

Transitional Job/Earnfare allows participants who have performed Community Workfare the maximum allowable hours an opportunity to earn cash assistance and gain additional work experience.

After participants perform Community Workfare for the maximum allowable hours (their SNAP benefits divided by the state minimum wage) they can participate in Transitional Job/Earnfare and receive cash benefits.

PLEDGE TO SERVE ALL ABAWDS

The Act authorizes FNS to allocate \$20 million annually to State agencies that commit, or pledge, to ensuring the availability of education, training, or workfare opportunities that permit able-bodied adults without dependents (ABAWDs) to remain eligible beyond the 3-month time limit.
