


The LA Metro Chamber Mission

Types of Problems

SIMPLE

LIKE BAKING A CAKE

Easy to do.

Re-creating the proven.

Low Risk of Failure

Can do it myself.

KNOWN

(Easy. I can do this)

COMPLICATED

LIKE MAKING A ROCKET

Difficult to do. Improving what works. Risks are many & managed The right team can do it.

KNOWABLE

(Difficult but doable)

COMPLEX

LIKE RAISING A CHILD

Risk not easily Managed The Village is needed. Relationships are key.

UNKNOWABLE

(No "right" answer)




What is Collective Impact?

Collective impact is a network of community members, organizations, and institutions from different sectors who achieve measurable impact by learning together, aligning, and integrating their actions to achieve population and systems level change. Collective impact is a commitment to solving problems are too big for any one organization to solve on their own.



Are you ready for Collective Impact?

Identify the *SPECIFIC* social problem that should be addressed in your community!



Are you ready for Collective Impact?

Are there multiple actors in the system who can influence this social problem?



Are you ready for Collective Impact


Is Collective Impact the *most appropriate* solution for solving this social problem?

- Is the system fragmented, disconnected, and broken?
- Do multiple sectors need to work together to address the issue?
- Are the majority of end -users in the system affected by this social problem?

Are you ready for Collective Impact?

Is the community ready for cross -sector collaboration?

- Are there influential champions who can provide leadership?
- Do financial resources exist to support collaboration for at least 12 months?
- Is there a history of collaboration in the community?
- Is there urgency for change on this issue?



The Five Elements of Collective Impact



Common Agenda

A shared understanding of the problem and a shared vision to solve it



Shared Measurement

Metrics tracked to show progress and support continuous learning and accountability



Mutually Reinforcing Activities

Coordinated activities through a mutually reinforcing plan of action




Continuous Communication

Constant and open communication that builds trust, strengthen relationships, and supports mutually beneficial objectives



Backbone Support

There is an organization with staff that has specific skills to support the work of the Strengthen LA Partners



The Common Agenda

The development of the common agenda has included a diverse set of voices and perspectives from multiple sectors (including input from community members in many Collective Impact initiatives)

- Partners have achieved a common understanding of the problem
- Partners have come to consensus on the initiative's ultimate goal(s)
- Partners have committed to solving the problem using an adaptive approach with clearly articulated strategies and agreed upon actions.

Shared Measurement

- The process of designing and managing the shared measurement system is participatory and transparent
- Quality data on a set of meaningful indicators is available to partners in a timely manner
- Sufficient funding and resources are available to support the technology platform, training, and technical support




Mutually Reinforcing Activities

- Partners have developed and are using a collective plan of action
- Partners are coordinating their activities to align with the plan of action
- Partners have filled gaps and reduced duplication of efforts



Continuous Communication



- Structures and processes are in place to engage CI partners, keeping them informed and inspired
- Structures and processes are in place to engage the CI initiative's external stakeholders, keeping them informed and inspired

Backbone Support

- The backbone infrastructure effectively guides the Collective Impact initiative's vision and strategy
- The backbone infrastructure ensures alignment of existing activities and pursuit of new opportunities toward the initiative's goal
- The backbone infrastructure supports the collection and use of data to promote accountability, learning, and improvement.



Keep in mind...

- Collective Impact is not a solution, it is a problem solving process!
- Collective Impact requires a lot of up front planning.
- Be willing to change how you do business.
- Collective Impact is only as good as the partners;
 build a culture of relationships, trust, and respect!
- Prioritize equity!!!
- Collect data.
- Customize the tools to meet local need.
