



#### Estimated Food Security Status among College Students, 2020



#### Who is a student?

Whether an individual is considered to be enrolled in an institution of higher education for SNAP eligibility purposes is defined in regulation by three criteria:

Enrollment status

Type of school

Type of curriculum




#### **Enrollment status**

 Individuals enrolled in an institution of higher education at least half-time

 The institution of higher education determines what is considered half-time enrollment.



#### Who is a student?



**Student:** Individuals enrolled in an institution of higher education at least half-time



Not a student: Individuals enrolled less than half-time

The institution of higher education determines what is considered half-time enrollment.





#### What is an "institution of higher education (IHE)"?





A business, technical, trade, or vocational school, in a curriculum that normally requires a high school diploma or equivalent (GED) for enrollment in the curriculum

A regular curriculum at a college or university that offers degrees, regardless of whether a high school diploma is required

Example 1:

Angela is enrolled half time in a beauty school that requires either a high school diploma or equivalency exam for enrollment.

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Angela is an individual enrolled at an institution of higher education, and therefore a student for the purposes of SNAP.

Example 2:

Brian is enrolled half time in a technical school. The school requires a high school diploma or GED for their degree programs.

Brian is enrolled in a one-year certificate program that does not require a HS diploma or GED.

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Brian is enrolled half time in a technical school. The school requires a high school diploma or GED for their degree programs.

Brian is enrolled in a one-year certificate program that does not require a HS diploma or GED.

Brian is not a student at an institution of higher education for SNAP.





 Junior colleges, community colleges, colleges or universities

- Regular curriculum
  - Varies from school to school
  - Generally includes degree programs (associate's, bachelor's, graduate degrees)





#### Programs outside the "regular curriculum"

- Remedial education
- Continuing or community education
- Professional development
- English for speakers of other languages
- Workforce development/training programs
- Occupational training
- Short-term certificate programs





#### **Examples of Programs outside the "regular curriculum"**

 Reimagine Arkansas Workforce Project at the University of Arkansas offers professional and workforce development

 Northern Virginia Community College offers continuing education and workforce development programs

 Bunker Hill Community College in Massachusetts offers a wide array of community and workforce development opportunities





#### Example 3:

Catrina enrolled half-time in an ESL certificate program at Northern Virginia Community College. Certificate program does not require high school diploma or equivalent.



## Example 3:

Catrina enrolled half-time in an ESL certificate program at Northern Virginia Community College. Certificate program does not require high school diploma or equivalent.

Because she's not enrolled in the college's regular curriculum, Catrina is not a student at an institution of higher education for the purposes of SNAP.

The lack of a high school diploma requirement is irrelevant.

Derek enrolled full-time in a bachelor's program at Harvard University.

Derek is a student enrolled in an institution of higher education for the purposes of SNAP, because he is enrolled in Harvard's regular curriculum.




#### The takeaway

Not all students at the **same school** will be considered "enrolled in an institution of higher education" for SNAP.









#### Eligible vs. ineligible students

If a student is enrolled in an institution of higher education at least half-time, they are **only** eligible for SNAP if they meet an exemption.

#### Exemptions include:

Working 20+ hours a week Being under age 18 or over age 49

Care for dependent child under age of 6

Many more!





#### Student eligibility & work requirements

Students enrolled **at least** halftime in any recognized school, training program, **or** IHE Students enrolled **less than** halftime in any recognized school, training program, **or** IHE



Exempt from work requirements, including ABAWD time limit & mandatory E&T



Must comply with work requirements, ABAWD time limit, and mandatory E&T, unless they meet another exemption



Must meet SNAP student exemption\*



**Do not** have to meet SNAP student exemption

\*Only for students enrolled in an IHE



#### Example 5:

Eduardo is 18 years old, taking one general education credit per semester at a community college that offers associate's degrees. The college considers half-time to be two classes/semester.

- Is Eduardo enrolled in an institution of higher education?
- Does he have to meet a student exemption?
- Does he have to comply with work requirements?



#### Example 5:

Eduardo is 18 years old, taking one general education credit per semester at a community college that offers associate's degrees. The college considers half-time to be two classes/semester.

- Is Eduardo enrolled in an institution of higher education?
  - N/A: enrolled less than half time
- Does he have to meet a student exemption?
  - No: enrolled less than half time
- Does he have to comply with work requirements?
  - Yes, unless he meets another work requirement exemption. The student exemption to the work requirements only applies to students enrolled half-time or more.

Frank is 58 years old, enrolled half-time in a re-skilling workforce development program at a community college that offers associates degrees.

Is Frank enrolled in an institution of higher education?

Does he have to meet a student exemption?

Does he have to comply with work requirements?





#### Example 6:

Frank is 58 years old, enrolled half-time in a re-skilling workforce development program at a community college that offers associates degrees.

- Is Frank enrolled in an institution of higher education?
  - No: enrolled outside the regular curriculum
- Does he have to meet a student exemption?
  - No: not enrolled in an IHE
- Does he have to comply with work requirements?
  - Maybe: he is enrolled at least half-time, but not in an IHE.





## Screening

States must screen individuals for:

Student classification & exemptions

Work requirement exemptions

Referral for E&T (both voluntary & mandatory)

General work requirement, incl. mandatory E&T

ABAWD time limit



#### **Screening in Practice**

Make use of the information that you are already collecting for other eligibility purposes to screen.

The **application**, **periodic report**, and **recertification** are good sources for:

- Household composition (incl. children in the household)
- Age
- Disability
- Employment status and income
- Enrollment in school





#### Ask effective questions and follow up

Screen using clear, probing questions and follow up as needed:

Don't just ask: Are you a student?
Do ask:
<ul> <li>If you are a student, are you</li> </ul>
enrolled:
☐Full time
☐At least half-time
Less than half-time
☐Not sure





#### Screening in the interview

The interview is a critical opportunity to ask about:

Enrollment status

Program type

Exemptions









#### **Screening Tips**

- Conduct regular training
- Provide a script to discuss student eligibility during the interview
- Develop a checklist of exemptions and screening tips
- Partner with higher education organization to develop lists of IHEs and tools workers can reference quickly
