SNAP E&T Redesign in Ohio

Background


The redesign of the SNAP E&T program is based on direction from:

The General Assembly has required Ohio Department of Job and Family Services (ODJFS) to redesign SNAP E&T to meet the needs of employers.

The US Department of Agriculture has informed ODJFS that due to program design, **Ohio has the worst SNAP E&T outcomes in the Midwest**, and the state **must significantly change the program or lose funding**.

SNAP E&T

The SNAP E&T Program helps SNAP households gain skills, training, work, or experience that will increase self-sufficiency and help participants move into better jobs.


Work Group Recommendations




ODJFS convened a work group to hear directly from employers and stakeholders.

The three core recommendations of the work group are:

- Operate a voluntary program that gives **priority of service to unemployed ABAWDs who opt to enroll** and need help finding and keeping a job.
- Focus on helping people become work-ready and understand basic job etiquette as employers have been reluctant to work with the SNAP E&T program as it is currently structured.
- Make it possible for more than just ABAWDs to have the opportunity to participate through a voluntary program.





SNAP E&T Partnerships in West Virginia


Partnership Overview

- West Virginia DHS operates a successful <u>Voluntary</u> <u>SNAP E&T program</u>
- One successful SNAP E&T provider is <u>West Virginia</u>
 <u>Women Work</u>, who runs a Construction Pre Apprenticeship training that provides clients with job ready credentials (e.g. forklift certification) and hands-on
 training through real-world projects
- Mountaineer Food Bank offers support services and volunteer opportunities to WVWW students and DHS clients; Also makes referrals to SNAP E&T opportunities
